Briggs Lake. Thanks to everyone who donated to the fund. We reached our goal of \$9,500. That should put on a really nice show. Our vendor, ResPyro, is one of the biggest in the state. They do the Twins games, State fair, Vikings games and many more. We get a discount if we don't do our event on the 4th. Although prices did increase from last year... Our budget allows for us to have a show equivalent to last year's presentation.

The boat parades on Big Elk & Briggs, Rush & Julia start at noon Saturday the **2nd**

You do not need to pre-register to be in the parade. Floats on Big Elk should meet at the landing around 11:45 to get a boat number and registration form. Floats on the upper three lakes should meet at the Briggs - Rush channel around 11:30 to get a boat number and registration form

For all the lakes the boats go around clockwise. The Briggs parade will start on Rush. Anticipated times for the parade on your lake will be:

Rush Lake Start at 12:00. Time to circle Rush 20 minutes
Briggs Lake ... Arrive from Rush about12:20. Time to circle Briggs 40
minutes.

Lake Julia Arrive from Briggs approximately 1:00. Time to circle Julia and exit at Speedboat bay 30 minutes. Parade to end at 1:30.

1st place wins \$100, 2nd place wins \$75, 3rd place wins \$50, 4th place is honorable mention. Every lake has a group of judges. Put on your best show. They are watching you. Good Luck and have fun.

Summary from the June Healthy Lakes meeting

There were 5 Residents in attendance. We discussed the following

- BLCA update: BLCA is in support of #NoMowMay but doesn't feel the need to officially endorse it.
- Shoreline best practices and Hydrojet Infographic flyer will be distributed with the directory and copies will be available at BLCA events.
- TLID update: Two new members are needed to replace outgoing board members.
 Commitment would be one Monday night meeting a month for 3 years.
- Big Elk LID status: Nothing new
- Gentle footprints Projects and Grants: There are 6 projects.

Three are ready to go, one resident is doing his own planting, and 2 are considering options following engineering reports on projected costs. Project requests for next year can be submitted now to allow planning time.

- 2022 Water Quality Data Report: The first samples have been taken and delivered.
 Clarity depth on Briggs was 6 feet and 4 feet elsewhere.
- Sherburne County Park on Big Elk: no new developments on park progress but there have been numerous calls regarding vandalism and suspicious persons on the property.
- Fish stocking: The BLCA has stocked walleye in Big Elk. The DNR is responsible for the upper 3 lakes and it's unknown whether they will be stocking this year or not.

 Blue Gills have been stocked in all 4 lakes.
- Education: There was considerable discussion regarding how to better promote and educate our members and visitors regarding best safe practices for our lakes.

 A recommendation is being made to the BLCA board to place this as a priority.
- Other: A partnership with RSVP Americorps Seniors and the BLCA is being established.
 This is an organization that can help us recruit volunteers when needed and may give us broader community connections.
- Steve reported that this was the first time that we went over the high water ordinance mark with just rain, before any run-off reached us.
