ANOTHER RHUBARB RECIPE

RHUBARB BARS

CRUST

1 ½ c flour

3/4 c cold cubed butter

1/4 c powdered sugar

Pat into 9x13 and bake for 10-12 minutes at 350

FILLING

3 large eggs, lightly beaten

2 c white sugar

½ flour

½ tsp salt

4 c diced rhubarb

Pour on top of hot crust. Reduce oven temp to 325 and bake for 30 to 35 minutes or until filling is set and not jiggly.

Cool 30 minutes on counter and then put in refrigerator. Chill completely before cutting.

SOME NEWS ABOUT BIG ELK LAKE

From Gary Anderson on Big Elk Lake

I just received an email from James Johnson (Freshwater ,SCI) who performs lake wide surveys on all four of our BLCA lakes.

James reported that he found no Eurasian watermilfoil (EWM) on Big Elk during his survey this past week. This is very good news!

James also performed a Point Intercept survey (PI) on our lake this Spring. This type of survey assesses the distribution and density of all aquatic plants in Big Elk. I believe that this PI survey was first performed on Big Elk for the first time in 2022 and can be made in the following years to determine if the plant type and density changes.

Also, because of the grant awarded to Big Elk by the DNR, the expenses for James' Spring-2023 surveys (PI and EWM) will be reimbursed back to the BLCA 100% by the DNR.

In review, the current DNR grant that was awarded to Big Elk covered all expenses for the year 2022 and through June 30th of this year, 2023.

We will be looking for future grant money from the County (Soil & Water Conservation District) or from the DNR for the calendar year 2024.
