More funding may be sought to accommodate requests for free native plants from the Plant Bank.

COLA: No recent meeting/Nothing to report

Water Testing: Walt Munsterman will head up the water testing again this summer, beginning in May, with samples to be taken every other week. People on each lake have been trained and are ready to go! The strange weather this year should bring interesting results.

Big Elk Lake: Rosalie Musachio shared details about the new park, located at County Road 16 and 104th Ave. One trail is open, but there will be no trail along the lake. There will be no restrooms or boat launches. Twenty-two more buildings still need to be deconstructed. The historical site will have a low impact on traffic in the area.

OLD BUSINESS:
